**Scripture: Genesis 1:26-27 / Romans 3:10-12**

**TITLE: Unlike Any Other**

It was once said, “We don’t have a soul. We are a soul. We happen to have a body.” What a unique perspective on mankind. But it’s right. Our bodies fail us. Our bodies grow old and return to the earth. But our souls are eternal. They never die. Our souls explain why we are spiritual. This is why we’re fascinated with the concepts of spirits, ghosts, and angels. This is why we look for a higher power. It’s why we look for ways to connect with God. But unfortunately, many of us are looking for that relationship in all the wrong places.

So how do we know we have a soul? What does being spiritual mean?

Let’s go back to the Bible to answer these questions.

Genesis 1:26-27 (NLT) says,

“Then God said, “Let us make human beings in our image, to be like us. They will reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, the livestock, all the wild animals on the earth, and the small animals that scurry along the ground.”

<sup>27</sup> So God created human beings in his own image.

In the image of God, he created them;  
male and female he created them.”

When you read the Creation account in Genesis 1-2, you see that mankind is in a class of its own. God spoke the universe, the world, and living creatures into existence. At the end of each Creation day, he said, “It was good.” But then God does something different with mankind. God wants to make mankind in His own image.
